Motion: Commissioner Wright made a motion to approve Resolutions a & b accepting the offers of \$2,655 for 421 Stevens Street and \$3,581.86 for 350 Locust Lane seconded by Vice Chairman Southerland.

Action: The motion passed unanimously.

ITEM 6. ABC BOARD

Mr. Cleo Bratcher, Chairman of the Hoke County ABC Board, introduced ABC Board member Alfred K. Leach, Jr. to the Board of Commissioners. Mr. Leach explained that the ABC Board is considering placing an ABC store at a location along the Hwy 401 corridor. The Cumberland County ABC store located at the intersection of Hwy 401 and Gillis Hill Road has been very successful. The Hoke ABC Board believes now is the opportune time to expand to a second location. There's a shopping center being constructed called Stonegate Center. Construction is not complete, so if action is taken quickly the unit being considered could be upfitted by the contractor to make it more suitable for a retail business such as an ABC store. The developer has offered a 5-year lease with a provision that the lease can be terminated after 3 years if the store is not profitable.

The ABC Board has no working capital, but the annual profits could cover the cost of setup and purchase of inventory. Inventory is expected to be approximately \$120,000. The ABC Board has explored various ways of raising these funds, including asking the County if the ABC Board could retain the distribution funds from the existing store instead of distributing them to the County at the end of the year. This is prohibited by statute. Another funding source they considered was a loan from Lumbee River Electric Membership Cooperative. That loan, however, would require collateral. Finally, the ABC Board explored the possibility of acquiring a loan from the County's Revolving Loan Fund. The Revolving Loan Fund is an Economic Development tool that assists existing business to expand and create jobs. The funds would be repaid by lowering the ABC distributions in 2017 and 2018. This would allow a buildup of capital.

Located on Hwy 401, the store would serve a population of roughly 46,000 people within a 5 mile radius. The average age of these residents is 30 so the demographic is favorable for an ABC store to be located there.

Vice Chairman Southerland and Commissioner Wright agreed that this would benefit the County. Commissioner Hunt asked how many employees the new store would need. Mr. Leach replied that they would need a store manager and part-time staff of five.

Motion: Commissioner Wright made a motion that the Board approve a loan in the amount of \$150,000 from the County Revolving Loan Fund seconded by Vice Chairman Southerland.

Action: The motion passed unanimously.

The County Manager requested that the 2017-2018 Certifications and Assurances agreement for the Hoke Area Transportation System be added to the agenda. This needs to be heard and approved in order for the County to receive Federal and State funding.

Motion: Commissioner Wright made a motion that the 2017-2018 HATS Certifications and Assurances agreement be added to the agenda as Item 7, seconded by Vice Chairman Southerland.

Action: The motion passed unanimously.

ITEM 7. Approval of the 2017-2018 HATS Certifications and Assurances Agreement.

HATS Director Nancy Thornton addressed the Board. The Certifications and Assurances agreement must be approved each year in order for the County to receive Federal and State funding.

Motion: Commissioner Wright made a motion to approve the 2017-2018 HATS Certifications and Assurances agreement, seconded by Vice Chairman Southerland.

Action: The motion passed unanimously.

Vice Chairman Southerland advised the Board members that he serves on the Fayetteville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (FAMPO) Board and was recently advised by their Director, George Strickland that next year, HATS will receive an additional \$70,000 in grant funds for operation and will likely receive discretionary funds to go toward building a HATS facility. Vice Chairman Southerland recognized Director Nancy Thornton for her hard work.

ITEM 8. HOMELESS SHELTER PRESENTATION

Bishop Al Anderson addressed the Board. He has prepared a PowerPoint presentation about a proposed shelter in Hoke County. Bishop Anderson introduced Ms. Betty Perkins.

Ms. Perkins began by explaining that a "Point in Time" study is a survey to determine the actual number of homeless individuals in a community on a specified date. These studies are conducted nationwide. Individuals and organizations that serve the homeless are asked to participate. In 2012, Ms. Perkins and Ms. Martha Beatty conducted the first Point in Time study in Hoke County. At that time, 82 homeless individuals were identified.

A Point in Time study is scheduled to be conducted in Hoke County on January 25, 2017. This will be led by Bishop Al Anderson and the Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Center.

Bishop Anderson introduced Ms. Tracy Morrison, with the group Family Endeavors. The number of homeless will affect the amount of funding for programs such as Subsidized Housing. Family Endeavors concentrates their efforts on homeless Veterans. They address risk factors that cause a Veteran to become homeless. Family Endeavors also assists the individuals in areas such as overcoming credit issues and finding job opportunities. Hoke County lacks the resources, such as funding and shelters, to adequately fund programs and address the needs of homeless individuals. Bishop Anderson introduced Mr. Floyd Long, formerly a homeless Veteran. Mr. Floyd met Bishop Anderson approximately 1-1/2 years ago. Bishop Anderson took him to the soup kitchen and fed him and then worked to find him housing. Next, Mr. Ron Flippin discussed the importance of addressing the mental health of homeless individuals.

Bishop Anderson said that the shelter would be open 24 hours, seven days per week. Sheriff Hubert Peterkin has assured Bishop Anderson that the Sheriff Department will respond quickly whenever they are needed.

Bishop Anderson said he is compiling information from contractors about the cost of renovating the building the soup kitchen is in on Oakdale Gin Road to also serve as a shelter. Bishop Anderson introduced Mr. Ted Currie with ABC Construction. The plan is to add a metal building on to the existing wooden structure. He is waiting on plans to be drawn in order to estimate a cost for the work.

Bishop Anderson added that ultimately he hopes to have a small church within the structure as well as a men's' dorm and women's' dorm, both with cots, and the soup kitchen. The facility must be staffed for supervision and to maintain security. He is concerned about housing children so he hopes to use the Domestic Violence Center to assist in finding housing for mothers with children.

Bishop Anderson said that his purpose at this meeting was to find out if there's help available to fund the shelter. Chairman Leach asked Bishop Anderson who the members of his Board are. Bishop Anderson replied that his Board members are James Allen, Ronald Flippin, Betty Perkins, Melba Aikens, Janice Davis and himself. He added that he needs additional Board members.

Vice Chairman Southerland commented that he sees a need for a homeless shelter in Hoke County. Bishop Anderson's organization appears to be private, non-profit, and faith-based. It will have to be determined what the County can do to help. Chairman Leach recommended that they get a grant writer if they don't already have one. Commissioner Thomas thanked Bishop Anderson for his presentation and expressed his support for his vision. Chairman Leach asked Bishop Anderson to keep the Board informed of his progress.

ITEM 9. NCACC VIDEO

The Board viewed a brief video from the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners which updated them about Association activities during January, 2017.

ITEM 10. MANAGER'S REPORT

County Manager Letitia Edens advised the Board that there will be a Department Head meeting on Wednesday, January 25, 2017. Included will be a presentation from Emergency Management Director Freddy Johnson about the Hurricane Matthew After-Action plan.

The annual meeting of the NC Southeastern Partnership will be held on January 31, 2017 at 6:00 pm. She asked that Board members let her know if they plan to attend so that she can RSVP.

ITEM 11. CLOSED SESSION – ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OR PERSONNEL

No closed session was held.

Commissioner Hunt commented that he had spoken with Deborah Carpenter, Director of Child Nutrition for Hoke County Schools and she told him that the school system received their first large shipment of food, valued at \$47,497 and donated to the School System at no cost. Ms. Carpenter wished to thank the Board for approving funds for the large walk-in freezer in the FY 2017 budget. The School System would not be able to accept donations such as this if not for the new freezer.

ITEM 12. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Hoke County Board of Commissioners, Commissioner Thomas made a motion to adjourn, with Commissioner Hunt seconding. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.
